Competition Guidelines

1. A student may not submit more than one paper for the Betts Writing Award.
2. The manuscript (excluding endnotes, appendices, and bibliography) is limited to twenty-five (25) typed, double-spaced pages. It should conform to the rules of *The Chicago Manual of Style* regarding endnotes, bibliography, and other stylistic matters.
3. All personal identification information should be removed from the document itself (e.g., writer's name or university in page numbers, endnotes, title page or first page). The student's paper title, university/college, permanent address and current contact information should appear only in the body of the email message to which the paper is attached.
4. The paper should be submitted as an email attachment in one of the following formats -- .rtf, docx, or .pdf – to Dr. Randolph Hollingsworth, University of Kentucky (dolph@uky.edu) on or before the deadline: **midnight on Friday, September 11, 2015.**
5. The submission must be accompanied by an email message from the student's supervising history instructor (or department chair), recommending the paper and certifying that it was written for an undergraduate course and completed in the 2014-2015 academic year.

Competition Guidelines

1. A student may not submit more than one paper for the Clark Writing Award.
2. The manuscript (excluding endnotes, appendices, and bibliography) is limited to twenty-five (25) typed, double-spaced pages. It should conform to the rules of *The Chicago Manual of Style* regarding endnotes, bibliography, and other stylistic matters.
3. All personal identification information should be removed from the document itself (e.g., writer's name or university in page numbers, endnotes, title page or first page). The student's paper title, university/college, permanent address and current contact information should appear only in the body of the email message to which the paper is attached.
